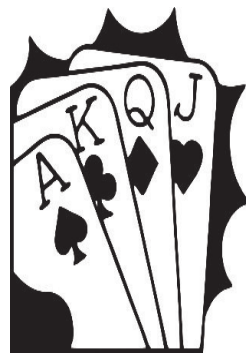
God, thank you for a new year. May everyone in our family be willing to begin anew with a clean slate.

A Reflection for the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God

January 1 is the oldest celebration of Mary in the Catholic Church. The custom of honoring the Virgin on the first day of the New Year originates in the sixth century, when her celebration was tied to the octave day of Christmas, the eighth day after December 25. In doing so, ancient preachers would remind their congregations about the role that Mary played in the history of salvation. Jesus was born of a woman, and so, as Eucharistic Prayer 4 states, "Made incarnate by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, he shared our human nature in all things but sin." The human nature of Christ is rooted in his being born like us. As we round out the Christmas celebration with its Octave Day on January 1, we venerate the woman who gave birth to him.

There is a dual action in today's Gospel that is sometimes overlooked. The shepherds find the infant in the manger as has been told to them by the angel. And then they go out to tell others about the child. In the meantime, Mary reflects on all these things in her heart. These are the two complementary stances of the Christian: action and reflection. Both are needed for a balanced spiritual life. It is, in effect, putting into practice the two great commandments: love God and love your neighbor.

As we begin the New Year, it is customary to make resolutions: to diet, to exercise, to change something in one's life. Like Mary, who reflected on the events surrounding the birth of her child, we take some time to reflect on our own lives: where we have been, and where we are going. The Gospel gives us the opportunity to situate that reflection in a spiritual context. What does the birth of Jesus mean for me spiritually (reflection), and what do I intend to do about that in my daily life (action)?

Una Reflexión sobre la Solemnidad de María, la Santa Madre de Dios

El 1ro. de enero es la más antigua celebración de María en la Iglesia Católica. La costumbre de dar honor a la Virgen el primer día del año en el Año Nuevo se originó en el siglo sexto, cuando su celebración estaba relacionada con la octava de Navidad, es decir, el octavo día después del 25 de diciembre. De este modo, los predicadores antiguos recuerdan a sus congregaciones el papel que María tuvo en la historia de la salvación. Jesús nació de una mujer y por lo tanto, como la Oración Eucarística 4 lo establece "Hecho encarnado por el Espíritu Santo y nacido de la Virgen María, el compartió nuestra naturaleza humana en todo excepto en el pecado." La naturaleza humana de Cristo está basada en que nació como nosotros. A medida que avanzamos en la celebración de la Navidad con su Octavo Día el 1ro. de enero, veneramos a la mujer que dio a luz a Jesús.

Hay una doble acción en el evangelio de hoy que a veces se pasa por alto. Los pastores encuentran al niño en el pesebre tal como se los había dicho un ángel. Y luego salen afuera a contarles a otros acerca del niño. Mientras tanto María reflexiona sobre todas estas cosas en su corazón. Estas son las dos actitudes complementarias del cristiano: acción y reflexión. Ambas se necesitan para una vida espiritual balanceada. Es, en efecto, poner en práctica los dos grandes mandamientos, amar a Dios y amar al prójimo.

Al comenzar el año nuevo se acostumbra a hacer promesas: dietas, ejercicios, cambiar algo en la vida de uno. Como María, que reflexiona en los acontecimientos que rodearon el nacimiento de su hijo, nos tomamos un tiempo para reflexionar en nuestras propias vidas: dónde hemos estado y hacia dónde vamos. El evangelio nos da la oportunidad de situar esa reflexión en un contexto espiritual. ¿Qué significa para mí espiritualmente el nacimiento de Jesús (reflexión) y qué es lo que pretendo hacer con eso en mi vida diaria (acción).

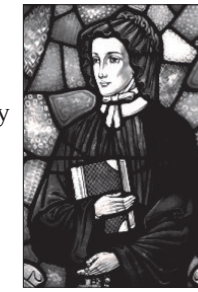
